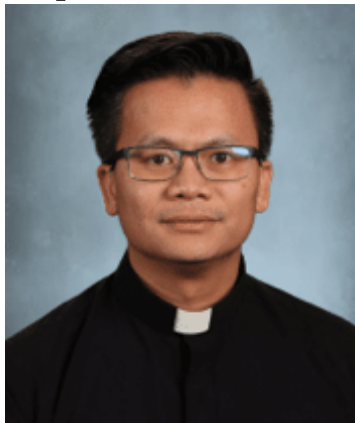

**Farewell to our Pastoral Year Seminarian, Fortunatus Nnadi**

*Here is the welcome note Fortunatus wrote after arriving*

"I am Fortunatus Chisom Nnadi. I am a seminarian and will be here until May 1, 2026, to learn under the guidance of our pastor, parochial vicar, deacons, and everyone here at Holy Family. I arrived on September 18 from St. Cyprian in Sunnyvale, where I was privileged to live with the priests as I continued to listen to God's voice and ask for the grace to respond faithfully.

Since attending our parish's Pilgrims of Hope event last weekend, a question posed by the event organizers, "What gives you hope?" has stayed on my mind. Of course, I knew it was Jesus who gives me hope. But something about that answer felt incomplete. Not knowing what was missing, I set it aside for later.

Listening to the stories of Fr. John Hoang and Michelle Troutman during the event, and reading the responses of other parishioners, it finally clicked. Images flooded my mind – sweet memories of Holy Family's recently concluded festival: how our pastor, parochial vicar, deacons, parish and school staff, fathers, mothers, teens, our school children, and the entire Holy Family community warmly introduced and welcomed me.

For those three days, many approached me, extending a handshake or a hug, introducing themselves, and saying with such tenderness and care, "Welcome to Holy Family." At first, I thought it might be a festival thing. I was wrong! Since the festival ended, more members of this amazing parish community have offered high-fives (thanks to our school children), handshakes, and hugs, while introducing themselves and saying again, "Welcome to Holy Family." There it was. I had found what was missing in my initial response to the question, "What gives you hope?" Indeed, it is Jesus who gives me hope – Jesus revealed through your smiles, warmth, tenderness, and love. Here at Holy Family, I have seen how Jesus borrows our faces, our smiles, our hands, and our hearts to reveal God's self to others. Through your warm welcome, God has made hope concrete and near. I feel very welcomed.

What I hear is Jesus, Mary, and Joseph saying, "Welcome home," to the Holy Family, to the journey, and to the calling He places in each of our hearts. Welcome home.

## Veterans Memorial of San José/Santa Clara Valley

Public art honoring those who took time from their lives to serve the needs of our nation in one of the six military branches. A field of flag poles in a formation representing a company, behind a glass wall with life-size figures of military personnel from many eras. On the glass wall are 50 textual remembrances culled from 3,000+ submissions from Santa Clara Valley veterans. Take time to consider sacrifices made by Veterans.



## Vietnam War Memorial

Visit the San Jose Vietnam War Memorial, downtown at Confluence Point (W. Santa Clara St. between Delmas Ave. & Guadalupe Expwy.) This memorializes 142 men who gave the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Don't judge them by the politics of the Vietnam War but remember them for their bravery. Do not weep for their passing; appreciate their courage and let them not be forgotten.

## May Notable Days and Birthdays

**May 13, 1846: Pres. Polk had Congress declare war on Mexico.** 11,300 US were killed but parts of Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Utah and Colorado were annexed to the US.

**May 27, 1937:** The grand opening of the Golden Gate Bridge was celebrated by 200,000 people strolling across it.

**May 7, 1954: French Indochina War ended** with the fall of Dien Bien Phu, a stunning victory by the Vietnamese over French forces. Vietnam was then divided in half at the 17th parallel in 1955

**May 5, 1961: Alan Shepard became the first American in space,** piloting Freedom 7 in a 15-minute 28-second suborbital flight reaching 116 miles above the earth. (23 days after the first human in space, cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin

**May 7, 1992: 27<sup>th</sup> Amendment ratified,** prohibiting Congress from giving itself pay raises.
