Praying with the Scriptures

As members of the mystical body of Christ, it is important that we immerse ourselves in reading the scriptures and praying with them so that we constantly allow it to shape and direct our lives. Learning the faith and living the faith cannot be achieved without the Scriptures. The word of God defines our identity, it nourishes our souls and brings us together as Christ's children, and it deepens our intimacy with God. Holy Scripture is the word of God addressed to every human being and it remains relevant in every time and place.

Lectio Divina is one of the ancient traditions of the Church. Pope Benedict XVI referred to it as a "prayerful listening to the Word of God." Let us take time out this year to build our relationship with God by praying with the Scriptures using the following steps:

1. **Read:** Choose a short passage from the bible, preferably the Gospel according to Luke since this is Year C and dedicated to Luke's Gospel, or any other book of the bible of your choice.
2. **Meditate:** Using your imagination, enter into the Biblical passage you have read, imagine the setting, the people and action. Through this you are able to encounter the text and discover meanings for your life.
3. **Pray:** Offer your personal response to the text you have read by praying for graces, offering thanks or praises, asking for forgiveness or healing, etc.

4. **Contemplate:** Allow yourself to be absorbed in the words of God as the Holy Spirit draws you into His presence through scripture. In what areas is God inviting you to take action from this prayer? Thank God for this gift and invitation as you conclude your prayer.

Traveling in the next few months? Add a Catholic Shrine or Holy Place to your plans! Here's another site for your consideration. Go to the heartland of Kansas and visit a unique shrine. Only 1,789 miles sort of easterly on Interstates 15 & 40 & US-54 and I-35 (and a few smaller State highways).

Shrine of St. Philippine Duchesne, Mound City, Kansas.



Saint Philippine Duchesne was born in France and served during the French Revolution helping the sick and the poor. After becoming a Nun of the Society of the Sacred Heart, she went to New Orleans in 1818, then on to St. Charles, MO. where she opened a school, later a convent, and finally, an orphanage.

Despite her desire to work with the native population, her Bishop kept her in St. Charles until at the age of 72 she was allowed to go to Kansas where she started a school for the Potawatomi Indians. While there she earned the nickname as "the lady who prays all the time".

After one year she was sent back to the Mother House in St Charles. But her short time in Kansas was fruitful. As a result, there are two shrines to her: one in Mound City and one across the border in Missouri. The shrine in Kansas is in Sacred Heart Church

The original site of her community was preserved as a park and shrine with crosses marking the graves of over 600 Native American Catholics and an altar and cross marking the location of the original church.
