Thoughts about Prayer –

Here are some thoughts about prayer shared with me by a friend some time ago. I hope they are beneficial to strengthening your prayer life.

- Believe - You have to be God's biggest fan. Your confidence in the Lord needs to be at its peak when you get ready to pray. Feeling doubt? Fake it 'til you make it. Affirm God's goodness, generosity, and power. Say it loud and say it proud. Your belief will trump doubt when you begin your prayers with praise for the Lord.

- Surround Yourself in Quiet - Turn it all off before you turn it on in your prayer session. Shut the door. Turn off T.V. Power down the computer and phone. Sounds basic, but it's essential that you create a sacred space that is quiet. Listen to the faint buzz of silence and your thoughts will soon be receptive to listening to God's word. If you're praying in a busy place, surround yourself in quiet by simply closing your eyes and imagining a soothing sound to block out distractions.

- Use Your Words - A frustrated toddler is told to "use your words." It's the same in prayer. Talk to the Lord the same way you talk to your friends and family. Use everyday language. God isn't looking for flowery words of adoration, or archaic language.

- Spread Love - Use prayer to send powerful messages to others. Go beyond yourself and pray for strangers, loved ones, and people in positions of power and influence. Be a positive prayer force. Spread God's love through prayer.

- Name It - Give structure to your prayer life. Know that you'll begin prayers with praise. Include prayers for others. Remember a favorite scripture. By setting a pattern of generous prayer, your self-focused prayers find just the right level of importance. When you pray, you're saying; "I know there's something bigger than just me in the world." Set a pattern in prayer that honors the vastness of the Lord.

- Leave it Be - Do you like being in charge, having things your way and getting what you want? Sorry, but that's just not how prayer works. Once you realize that the Lord doesn't take orders, you'll be on your way to really praying effectively. It's a relief to know that God wants you to release your burdens to His loving care. Prayer is the hand-off. You have a partner in life's problems.

- He's Got You Covered - You have an angel on your shoulder and the spark of God in your soul. Spiritually you're covered. God is your protector, confidante, and guiding light. The Lord fills many roles in your life and it helps when you keep that in

mind when you pray. Think of God as your BFF and share your innermost thoughts. Know that you are safe because of His eternal protection - give thanks. Follow the Lord's example with good behavior and consideration for your fellow man.



Membership Growth

In Spring of 1993, 15 days after my 18th birthday, my Dad brought me to my First Degree. I remember feeling like a fish out of water. Our family was never particularly religious, though I was baptized and confirmed in the church. I had no religious mentors or friends, nor a particular priest who would make an impact on my life. I didn't read religious books or scripture and barely knew how to recite basic prayers. My Mass attendance was Christmas and Easter and other religious holidays. Needless to say, I wasn't a "practicing" Catholic in my youth and living in Santa Cruz was a negative secular influence on my beliefs and values. Dad didn't have me join the Knights of Columbus to be active, be an officer or volunteer; he had me take the First Degree because he wanted me to get life insurance.

In his eyes, the greatest benefit to becoming a member of the Order was the insurance. He knew that becoming an insurance member and getting insurance early, even without the responsibilities some associate with insurance, would provide some financial backbone at my young age. At that time, I would be lucky to have \$20 in my pocket at any given time. My first policy was a \$10,000 Whole Life policy at only \$8 per month (which my Dad paid). I believe I went to 1 or 2 business meetings, put my KofC pin and rosary in a drawer, and never really became active.

By age 28, I was unemployed and seeking work. Dad was retiring from the Order as an Insurance Agent, so I decided I'd "give it a try". I really had no other prospects for work.

Now, married and with a family, I have had a fine, 18 year tenure with the Order. My life insurance coverage with the Order is in the multi-millions and my Disability and Long Term Care insurance policies are affordable. More importantly than financial well-being and protection as a member, I am a more practical Catholic than ever. I pray daily, read

scripture, and regularly pray the rosary. I attend Mass every Sunday and observe Holy Days of obligation. I practice fasting. Over time, it wasn't a religious upbringing, nor a priest or friend that encouraged me to dive deep into my faith, *it was the Knights of Columbus*. I owe the Order and my Brother Knights (particularly my fellow Fraternal Insurance Agents) for me becoming the practical Catholic I am today.

It has been said many times "The Lord works in mysterious ways" and nobody could've predicted that it would be the Knights of Columbus Insurance program that would be the guiding hand that led me to a stronger Catholic faith.

I tell this story to encourage all members and wives, uncles, aunts, cousins, siblings or grandparents to **enroll your young man into the Knights of Columbus**, in person or online, and encourage him to get insurance with the Order.

My personal faith journey is a testament to the vision of Father Michael J. Mcgivney – to strengthen and unite men of the Catholic faith and to provide financial protection in the event of death or sickness. I am an example of both of these instances, and it was all because my Dad made me attend a First Degree and buy KofC Insurance.

Founded in 1692 by Padre Eusebio Kino in the center of a centuries-old Indian settlement. Razed during an Apache raid in 1770, by 1783, Franciscan missionary Fr. Juan Bautista Velderrain began construction on the present church using money borrowed from a rancher. The church's purpose was to provide a place of refuge for the natives who had converted to Christianity as well as for the priests and settlers in the area. It is the oldest European structure in Arizona and is considered the finest example of Spanish Colonial architecture in the US.

In 1821, San Xavier became part of Mexico. With the Gadsden Purchase of 1854, the Mission joined the United States. In 1872, Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet opened a school at the Mission. The Mission is still the parish church for area Native Americans today. It is located on the Tohono O'odham Nation San Xavier Indian Reservation about 10 miles south of Tucson
