Chaplain's Message



LOVE AND MARRIAGE

Love from the very beginning of time has been profound and everlasting. It must be an offshoot of the greatness of God's love of humankind. Everything seemed good until all was interrupted by sin. Sin changed the course of that which our God intended to be.

Love has become the most abused word in society. It is used for selfish gain and glory. A person falls in love with anyone or anything with the intention of using them for one's satisfaction. Love becomes the motivating factor of getting, acquiring, or possessing something in order to own it. It is a one-way traffic from the outside to the inside. Its sole purpose becomes indulging and gratifying oneself. This becomes natural and normal for everyone.

Even people contracting marriage are motivated by this love. When both parties have the same desire and concept of marriage as that, problems will soon arise. Arising since they have in mind to control and manipulate the beloved in order to enjoy life, undermining the good of their partner. They will arrive at the point of using each other and thereby reducing the other to a thing. As long as the person is usable, married life is fine. When they reach the peak of being undesirable, separation is inevitable. A separation or divorce eventually happens in this kind of relationship. Since one is seeking his/her own pleasure and then that desire becomes unquenchable, the relationship is broken. A reason for the nearly rampant broken marriages in our society is that it seems nobody wants to be a martyr nor do some sacrifices.

Chaplain's Message (Cont'd)

Some married couples believed that they truly loved each other from the start. It was not love (in the real sense of the word) but 'selfishness' coated with love. The desire to use, control, or manipulate one's beloved is not love but selfishness. In my opinion, these people should not contract marriage if they continue to prioritize their own welfare. Self-centeredness has no place in married life.

Love is so precious in the eyes of God as it reflects the image and likeness of God who is love. God's love is everlasting. It is unconditional. It is granted to the righteous and the sinners. Jesus offered His life on the cross for bad and good alike. As Jesus said, the greatest love that one can offer to a friend is to lay down his life for a friend (John 15:13). The kind of love that everyone must have to enter a sacramental marriage. The motivating factor that animates the heart to love the beloved to the extent of giving-up one's life.

This is not only one-way traffic. It gives, it shares, it sacrifices everything for the well-being of the beloved and in turn, seeing the happiness of other, becomes fulfilled and contented. If both have the same intention of giving and sacrificing for the other, what a beautiful relationship it might be. This is the fullness and happiness of marriage for people who truly love each other from the heart. Indeed, only death can separate that love.

When times get rough in marriage, look intently on the cross of Jesus and pray. Whatever pain and suffering one might experience, it's only a fraction of Jesus' pain. Draw courage and strength on the cross. Jesus is always there to help and lead the way to a brighter future.

In 1909 - 1910, Mother Cabrini purchased land in Golden to be used as a summer camp for her charges at the Queen of Heaven Orphanage in Denver, Colorado. All of the water needed for both drinking and cooking had to be brought up from the stream at the bottom of the canyon. In September 1912, the sisters complained to Mother Cabrini. She answered, "Lift that rock over there and start to dig. You will find water fresh enough to drink and clean enough to wash." The spring, which is housed in an 8,000-gallon tank, has never stopped running. It also houses a Stairway of Prayer, a grotto, and a convent.

Memorial Day's Original Name?

Gen. John Logan called for "Decoration Day" to recognize Northern Civil War Veterans with the first event on May 30, 1868, a date on which no significant battles had occurred. By 1890 all northern states had accepted this event while many Southern states celebrated their vets on other dates until WWI ended. In 1971 Congress moved it to the last Monday of May, made it a 3-day weekend and a federal holiday.
