## Grand Knight's Corner (Cont'd)

St. John Vianney became pastor of Ars, France, a town of less than 300, after the French Revolution which almost destroyed the Catholic faith in France. His devotion to his flock was legendary. His simple catechism for girls in the orphanage was attended by crowds of people and he spent 12 to 16 hours daily in the confessional for his parishioners and the multitude of pilgrims who came to his little church.

Fr. McGivney had similar problems as the immigrants in his church were pressured by America's factories, unions, political parties and fraternal organizations to turn away from their faith. Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus to combat these forces. As Bishop Blair's homily said, "In founding our fraternal order, he helped to save countless families from the indignity of destitution, and in doing that he also helped save them from the hopelessness that can lead to a loss of faith in God, in the church, and even in a nation." I read Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's report where he labeled this year as the Year of Fraternity, saying the Knights have always been about fraternity while also showing Charity and Unity. In this pandemic, Fraternity is needed more than ever and it's a challenge to be fraternal while physically distancing and wearing needed masks, but we are called to be brothers to all. I call upon each of us to call some fellow Knights each week to see how they are doing.

Knights are no strangers to pandemics -- the Russian Flu pandemic in 1890 was the cause of Fr. McGivney's early demise and the Knights work in the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic is historic. We need to "Leave No Neighbor Behind" and support the Church, community, and each other in these trying days.

Deacon Ray's reflection on the "Joy of the Gospel" was amazing. He helped us understand Pope Francis' call to evangelization by spreading the Joy of the Gospel. The Pope tells us how we are to radiate Joy when talking of God and the gospel of Jesus. If we aren't joyful, people will not be drawn to our message. Only a small few will be evangelized by

Catholic rules and regulations. We are called to talk about the love and mercy of God and show this mercy to all. Pope Francis asks us to give preference to the poor as Jesus did. He wrote that preaching the Gospel should be positive and should show Jesus' love and forgiveness. ## Chaplain's Message



### FAITH IN ACTION

To be a good teacher means to form and mold good students. In Jesus' life as a teacher, He has many followers. He chose only twelve men to be part of His inner circle. They were called by name and taught by way of word and example in their day-to-day life. Finally, they were commissioned to perform certain acts which the master commonly did. One of those was expelling demons from a possessed person. In Matthew's gospel (17:14-16) a man brought his epileptic son to the disciples to be healed but they were unable to do so. Then Jesus rebuked him and the demon went out of him and the boy was cured from that hour. (v.17)

When the disciples asked Jesus of their inability to perform exorcism, Jesus simply replied, their lack of faith. Faith is necessary to perform the works of Jesus. It is only God who can perform those miraculous actions for humans. As human as we are, we do not possess the ability. We can only participate in those acts if granted by God who is the author. Like the disciples of Jesus who have the ability and Jesus has commissioned them to perform those action.

The question remains, why they were unable to heal the boy. At this particular instance, the disciples had Jesus' power to do everything they were asked for. But as they perform the action, they let their healing come to their head instead of their heart, which is connected to Jesus. Once you disconnect your act of healing from the source or the healer, you can never perform the act entrusted to you. This is the temptation to own the action by yourself, which is totally unacceptable.

The disciples are instruments of God to reach His people with love. They must always be faithful and trustful to the giver of gift and from where the healing came.

As Christians in the world, you too have so many gifts. Gifts like life, health, family, job, possession, power, and talent that come from God. You should focus your attention to the origin of the gifts and be grateful. They must be used for the greater glory of the giver. Make yourself the channel of God's grace to shower His infinite love to His beloved people. Once you do a good act, never be tempted to glorify yourself, but move on to the source and be thankful to Him. Don't let pride dominate your life by owning everything you have as you dispose it to others. They are only gifts entrusted to you and they are meant to be shared. In doing so, you are only fulfilling the task commanded to you by bringing God closer to the people whose lives you touch.

Be one of the disciples of Jesus my brother Knights.

### **2020 Annual Report of the Supreme Knight Carl Anderson (An Extract on Columbus)**

"We do not fear an honest review of the work and legacy of Columbus. indeed, we welcome it. that is necessary, but it is not sufficient. We urge every city, state and province to undertake a public and careful review of its own treatment of the native peoples, both past and present.

That review will find no trace of Columbus. He was not there when the Puritans in Connecticut destroyed the Pequot nation. Nor was he there along the trail of tears walked by the Cherokee or at the massacres of Sand Creek or Wounded Knee, or in the hunting down of Chief Joseph and the Nez Perce. Columbus never called for the "extermination" of the native people of California as did the Governor of that state after gold was discovered there.

Scapegoating one man for what has happened throughout the United States is easy, but it masks the real history. Native peoples have a right to have their story told with accuracy and integrity. They have a right to an honest recounting of their history. Only in this way can we find a path of reconciliation, healing and justice. The Knights of Columbus is prepared to walk that path with them."

Remember this advice from the Supreme Knight when someone attacks Christopher Columbus. Columbus never even landed in what is now the US.

## IN SEPTEMBER, IT IS OUR UNITED STATES AIR FORCE

The official birthday of our US Air Force is September 18, 1947, but the Air Force's heritage goes back much further. From the first US military aircraft purchase in 1909 to 1947, the Air Force did not exist as an organization but was variously called: the Aeronautical Section, **Signal Corps** (1909); Aviation Section, **Signal Corps** (1914); **U.S. Army Air Service** (1918); **U.S. Army Air Corps** (1926), **U.S. Army Air Forces** (1941), and finally **U.S. Air Force** (1947). Though it kept as its "song" the Army Air Corps song.

World War II was over and the Korean War three years off when the Air Force ended its 40 years as an Army branch and became a separate service. Airpower became a major element of the nation's defense. President Truman signed the National Security Act of 1947, creating the Department of the Air Force and renaming the Department of War to Department of the Army, merged Army & Navy into the National Military Establishment (NME), and then created the Air Force. The three became the Department of Defense (DoD), renamed from the NME.

The Air Force is the aerial warfare branch of DoD and one of our (now) eight uniformed services. The USAF is one of the world's largest and most technologically advanced air forces. It articulates its core functions as: Nuclear Deterrence Operations; Special Operations; Air Superiority; Global Integrated Intel, Surveillance & Recon; Command and Control; Cyberspace Superiority; Personnel Recovery; Global Precision Attack; Building Partnerships; Rapid Global Mobility and Agile Combat Support. The Air Force emerged quickly from WWII and began creating its own exceptional history and heritage. Its former mission of Space Superiority will be handled by the newly forming "Space Force" 0 with elements of the AF and other services merged into that service.

### INTERESTED IN EARLY CATHOLIC HISTORY BY STATE?

**ALABAMA:** The 22<sup>nd</sup> state of our Union. DeSoto traversed much of the state in 1540 with 12 priests and 4 Dominican Friars. Mass was celebrated near today's Mobile; it is believed. Then La Salle came down the Mississippi in 1862 & claimed the area for France. The Mobile district was incorporated in a Parish in 1703 and mission sites followed. In 1763 France ceded the area to England who lost it to Spain in 1780. Spanish priests carried on the work until 1813 when the US took over. Alabama became a territory in 1817 and a State 2 years later. 1825 the Vicariate-Apostolic of Alabama & Florida was created with only one clergyman in the entire Vicariate. By 1829 he was the Bishop of Mobile. He invited many orders to serve the people. It took many years after the Civil War to rebuild the churches & recover. By the 1920's several orders were invited to serve the "Negro" population, separate from all others.
